1. WHAT IS TRUSTEES' WEEK?

Trustees' Week takes place from November 4th-8th this year.

It is designed to celebrate the achievements of nearly one million trustees across the UK - it's a time to thank them for their time, commitment and the effort they bring to help their charities, CIOs, charitable trusts, social enterprises or community groups thrive.

Throughout Trustees' Week there are opportunities for trustees to connect with other trustees, to share their experiences, and to develop their skills at a wide range of events and training sessions.

Each year, Trustees' Week has a theme and for 2024 it is...

Recruitment and Retention

According to the Charity Commission's [Breath of Fresh Air report](#), up to one in two charities have a trustee vacancy, and charities and voluntary organisations with vacancies are missing out on important skills and knowledge. NCVO will be launching a new report identifying the challenges of recruitment and retention, so that organisations can be better equipped to address the issue.

2. WHY CELEBRATE TRUSTEES' WEEK?

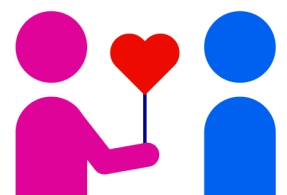


Trustees are nearly always volunteers, and their roles are vital to the third sector. So it's important to take the time during Trustees' Week to celebrate and recognise their efforts and all that they contribute to our local communities, the voluntary sector and society as a whole.

Celebrating Trustees' Week is also an ideal opportunity for local organisations to recruit more trustees, which can be a tricky task at times! By sharing the stories of those who volunteer their time to sit on trustee boards, you will not only be recognising their amazing contributions but spreading the word about the fantastic rewards that being a trustee can bring.

3. IDEAS TO HELP YOU CELEBRATE TRUSTEES' WEEK 2024

- Send cards to your trustees, thanking them for their time and recognising the important contribution they have made.
- Share their stories of what it means to be a trustee on your website or social media.
- Host a social event for your trustees to say thank you.
- Send thank you messages to your trustees on social media
- Work with other charities or groups to hold a joint event to either thank trustees or attract prospective trustees.
- Invite your local mayor or councillor to meet your trustee board and hear all about their work - and share the visit with your local newspaper, Facebook group or radio station.
- Hold a coffee morning to invite prospective trustees to visit your organisation and see what you do.
- Hold a 'speed matching' event with other local charities for anyone interested in becoming a trustee (the prospective trustees talk to each organisation or group for five minutes then rotates around the room so that they get a chance to talk to everyone).
- Give a talk to young prospective trustees at the local college or at young people's groups.
- Hold an open day and invite prospective trustees to visit your organisation and see your work. Introduce them to the beneficiaries, staff and other volunteers.
- Write a letter to your local paper publicly thanking your trustee board for all their hard work and talking about your organisation's achievements.
- Hold an 'awards night' where you can present fun awards to your trustees to mark particular achievements or recognise particular skills.
- Add the Trustees' Week logo to your website and email footers for that week - you can find the logos [here](#).
- Provide ways for your staff and trustees to engage with each other.
- Share links to useful resources for prospective trustees.

- Contact your local radio station and let them know all about being a trustee - maybe encourage one of your trustees to join you on air!
